# Dear Spirit-Sharing St. Markians:

Ethan had been so anxious about his upcoming solo in the school concert. Despite practicing his song over and over again for weeks, he still had visions of messing up and everyone in the audience laughing at him. The moment finally arrived, and Ethan stepped out nervously onto the front of the stage. His stomach was battling back the churning butterflies as his palms wouldn't stop sweating. In the hushed moment in front of hundreds of people, he was able to drive away the fears enough to pick up his instrument and start playing. By the end, he had played a beautiful rendition of his song. The crowd applauded and cheered. But Ethan felt disappointed. He knew he had missed a note or two, and somewhere in the middle he had lost the proper rhythm. He had practiced so hard for so long, and yet he knew it wasn't perfect.

Despite his disappointment, following the concert, an older woman approached him out of the crowd with tears welling up in her eyes. She thanked him for his song, explaining that her late husband used to play it for her, and Ethan's playing it that night on stage brought back such fond, loving memories for her. She didn't care if he missed a note or two, or even lost the beat, his music had moved her to recall a cherished moment in time.

Sometimes that is how it works in life. We may think we are not perfect, that we don't have enough skill, knowledge, or ability to do something meaningful. We try not to say anything or we give in to the fear of the embarrassment that may occur if we say the wrong thing, and so we do nothing. But really, as baptized children of God, filled with Christ's Spirit, we have abilities beyond even our own understanding. Just as Ethan stepped out on that stage with trepidation and played music that moved one stranger in the audience, we too can step up and trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us. If we but drive away the temptations of fear and learn to trust in God, we can be empowered to speak the right words, to comfort those feeling alone, to encourage those who feel lost, to inspire those who are seeking the truth. This Easter season, may we believe that God will use us in the right time, in the right way, to welcome the stranger, to sit with a visitor, to share the story of God's love and resurrection with someone who needs to hear of that joy. May you step up and trust in the Spirit of God.

# **Happenings and News in our Congregation**

# Council Meeting Happenings: March 26, 2024

- After opening the meeting in prayer, the council moved to hear from our guest speaker, Bill Rider of Home Paramount Pest Control, concerning the termite situation along the outside wall of the Music room. The two options of a spot treatment versus an entire building protection plan were presented. After presenting and answering all the council's questions, Mr. Rider departed. Council then discussed the issue further, remembering the previous year's termite spot treatments and the pros and cons of both options. Ultimately, the council decided to authorize the entire building bait system be completed as soon as possible. Pastor will contact Home Paramount to begin this work.
- Having completed that pressing issue, the council returned to the order of business by sharing blessings and moments of joy. It was noted that our president and wife, Mike and Gail, will be celebrating their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in April, that the church office is doing a great job and produced a great Holy Week bulletin to help us truly Worship this holy week, and a piece of music was shared from a Cross Keys Easter Cantata.
- Minutes, attendance, and a membership change were noted and reviewed by Council.
- In his report, President Mike Merlo mentioned that the Church needs to be a beacon of truth and goodness in a world that doesn't seem to learn from history and keeps repeating our own sins and mistakes.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. Pastor also noted ongoing supply company disappointments. Council gave permission to return to regular supplies and dispensers in kitchens and bathrooms around the church, instead of special units that limit our purchasing ability. Because of recent alarms at the church and the ongoing state of our world, Pastor also recommended that the council consider installing a system of recording cameras around the church building.
- Evangelism Committee gave their written report and noted the number of wonderful "God's Glory" program cards that have been submitted and posted in that hallway. These moments of Godly glory can be something anyone has done or heard about and shared to inspire others in the faith.
- Worship and Music Committee gave their written report and shared a bit of this
  upcoming Holy Week and Easter season, noting that a processional of youth will be
  involved on Easter and many more youth will be encouraged to take part in Preschool
  Sunday on April 7<sup>th</sup>.
- Hanover Area Council of Churches' minutes of special meetings and the regular Board meeting were shared with the council, which explained some of the recent changes and issues that are being proposed with the leadership of HACC.
- The Treasurer report for February was presented with noted concerns about trends and rising expenses.
- Council reviewed old and new business and having none adjourned until the April 23<sup>rd</sup>,
   4:00 pm meeting.




